On Saturday, October 21, Illinois Lutheran held its "Building on the Rock" Capital Campaign Pledge Dinner. This dinner was intended to raise awareness of the ongoing capital campaign to fund building projects for both the elementary and high school campuses. These improvements will help us offer a greater variety of co-curricular programs but what is of greater importance is the impact that these projects will have on our students' lives.

The highlight of the evening were four videos from ILHS graduates, Eric Dorn (2012) now a high school toacher

(2013), now a high school teacher, Lisa Becker O'Donnell (2001) a lieutenant colonel in the army, Luke Latzke (2023) a first year college student and Stephen Apt(2007), a WELS pastor. Each of them expressed the value and importance of co-curricular activities in the development of their Christian character and at the same time instilling these values into their everyday lives. These videos are posted on our school's YouTube channel (ILS TV). They serve

as a testimony to Illinois Lutheran's impact on our students' future.

The "Building on the Rock Capital Campaign" is a four-year fund raising program designed to raise \$3,000,000 for the completion of the grade school campus remodeling and the building of the I.M.A.C. (Illinois Lutheran Multipurpose Activities Center). This much needed structure will allow us to accommodate the wide variety of co-curricular

activities in both the grade school and high school which we currently find difficult to do. This clear span building will accommodate sports, music, drama and allow for large gatherings for concerts, church activities and community events. It will be a one of a kind structure in our community.


High School Golf


